Speech Topic and Information for each Age Group

Background;

Over the years that the speech competition has been running we have covered a variety of topics. Of particular importance was the commemoration of 100 Years of the Anzac tradition. This year our topics are more open, as we have seen that students love to speak about their own whānau connections. So, to reflect this, we are asking for speakers to use the topic "ANZAC and My Whānau" or "ANZAC and Me". This will allow our speakers to look into their own whakapapa and whanaungatanga, or that of someone they admire such as a national hero or fallen hero, and telling their story. For senior students this topic could be adapted to reflect a more sophisticated understanding. Perhaps a reflection on Patriotism and its meaning in a 21st Century world, or Patriotism in a bicultural society such as Aotearoa NZ. These topic choices are deliberately broad to allow speakers to explore their interests and passions.

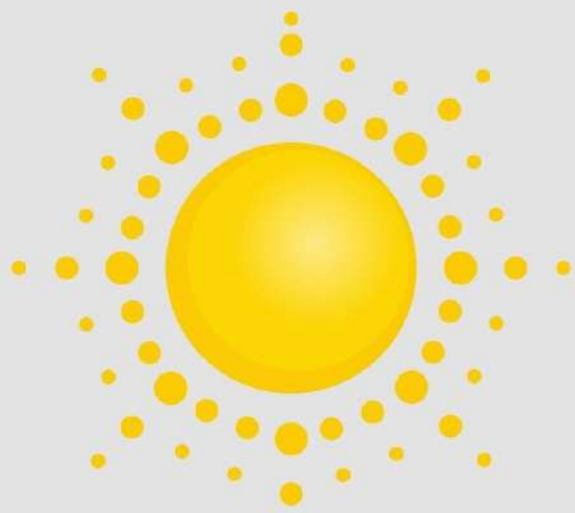
