Chairman's Report

Operations

At the time of writing this report we are still operating under Covid Level 2 conditions. This will change from Friday 3 December to the COVID Traffic Light System (TLS). We will be, from that date operating at the TLS Orange Level, which essentially is a no change situation from where we have been operating at under Level 2. The major variation is that ALL PERSONS entering the Club, as from Friday 3 December 2021, must be able to produce and have recorded an Official My Vaccine Pass. The Pass can be on a device such as your mobile phone or a printed paper copy, able to be scanned. There are absolutely no exceptions to this. ALL PERSONS means Taradale Club Members, family, friends and guests of Members, Staff, Visitors, Trades and Service people.

THE RULE IS STRAIGHT FORWARD,
NO MY VACCINE PASS, NO ENTRY, NO EXCEPTIONS.

The financial and regulatory penalties applicable to premises such as our's that do not comply are severe and we are not able to put our Club at risk through non-compliance.

Our new General Manager, Kim, now has her feet firmly under the desk and is working hard on bringing the Club into line in some important areas which have, to various degrees been neglected over recent times. Areas such as formal Operating Procedures, Health and Safety Procedures for Staff, Members and Visitors, Fire Evacuation Procedures have been sadly lacking attention. Kim is keen to meet as many members as she can and hopefully by now many of you have taken the opportunity to introduce yourself and welcome her to the Club. I am confident we now have a strong and capable Senior Management Team with our two most recent appointees, Gareth and Kim adding to an already great team.



Financial

We achieved a successful trading result for the month of October, with a satisfactory net profit excluding Government support measures of Wage Subsidy and Resurgence payments. Given we have continued to have many functions, which were booked earlier in the year cancelled or postponed, we have managed to achieve this result from normal day to day trading. This is positive looking forward as we hopefully return to again hosting more functions and events. We have experienced a lift in activity during November and this trend will continue in the weeks leading up to Christmas.

Of significance we have experienced a real lift in Restaurant trading in recent weeks. Whilst this was necessary, I take this opportunity to congratulate Gareth, our new Head Chef and his team for the great job they have done in launching our new menu's and for the quality of the meals they are producing. I do not recall a time when we have consistently received so many positive comments as to the quality of our Restaurant and Bar service food. Gareth has also taken hold of improving our margins through more astute purchasing, stock control and food preparation. He is proving to be a great acquisition to our team.

New Microphone

By now many of you would have heard we at long last, have a far better performing sound system in the Club. This has come about by a very generous offer from Peter Tutt, to purchase a new microphone and he would pay for it. Peter's offer was gladly accepted, and it is great to now be able to make announcements in the Club without the cutting in and out of voices. Many thanks Peter for your generous support in the true spirit of a great Club member.

Roof Repair

We have now officially heard from our Insurers, our claim for damage to the roof from last year's major storm, has been declined. Whilst it has been acknowledged the storm did exacerbate the leak problems we have experienced; the Insurers Loss Adjusters were strongly of the opinion the construction faults and deterioration of the roof and guttering are the major reasons for our leak problems. We are proceeding to obtain quotes to repair and/or replace damaged and poorly constructed areas, with a view to having the leaks remedied before next Winter. You may recall we were authorised at our last AGM to proceed with this major work.



Christmas Closure

With Christmas Day/Boxing Day this year falling on a Saturday/Sunday and bearing in mind Sundays and Mondays are traditionally very quiet days for the Club, we have decided the Club will be closed for three days, Saturday 25, Sunday 26 and Monday 27 December. This will give our Staff a well deserved three day break to share some quality Family Christmas time and some much needed rest towards the end of another difficult Covid affected year. We sincerely hope our Members will fully support our decision in this respect as a gesture of appreciation to our great team.



Matariki Tu Rakau

In 2022 with the agreement of the NCC, the Services' Association is planning to plant a Pohutukawa or Kowhai at the Taradale Soldiers' Cemetery (Lone Pine) in the gully below the Puketapu Rd to honour each of our WW2 fallen heroes, and their whanau.

These trees will of course add colour in the flowering, make the cemetery more picturesque for those visiting loved ones, and have a tree for those fallen who still lay in foreign soils standing with those of their comrades who did return and are now buried at Lone Pine. The trees will also attract other species of birds, bees etc to the area.

We are planning the planting for 5 June 2022, which is Arbor Day, and will again seek the assistance of any whanau of our heroes that we can locate and invite to the ceremony, and of the High Schools to help in preparing the site for the trees and helping in the physical planting.

William Lee's Unveiling

As many will be aware we are assisting the Remembrance Army locate the graves of WW1 service members who returned but have now passed on and are buried in Park Island Cemetery, many of which have no headstone. One such fallen hero was William Lee.

Father Bill's magic worked and on 6 Nov at 11am the clouds parted, the rain stopped for about an hour, and we unveiled William Lee's headstone without getting wet. It was a very special moment to be acknowledging a WW1 veteran with some of his whanau there from Whangarei (one of whom was 86) and some from Taumaranui.

The Unveiling was 'live streamed' and had people watching from all around the country. The Napier Army Cadet Unit added to the military aspect of the tribute as did having the Naval Liaison Officer, Paul Eady, there in uniform, wearing medals, along with our members.

The Remembrance Army have identified others from WW1 who don't currently have headstones, so there will be Unveilings to come in the future. In the meantime a couple of photos from William's ceremony:

Happy Holiday Season


