

A WORD FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

OPERATIONS

We have made a successful and positive start to Trading since moving to Alert Level 1. Attendance of our members has been pleasing as has been your acceptance of reduced opening hours and consolidation of Bar areas open to save lighting, heating and cleaning costs.

Make no mistake, the Covid 19 impact on our business has been considerable and the financial setback will take a long time to recover from, however, we are confident that with the support of our members and the work ethic of our Staff, we can do it.

As mentioned in our communications during lockdown, TOGETHER WE CAN AND WILL MAKE IT HAPPEN.

I take this opportunity to most sincerely thank our Staff, most of whom have taken on additional responsibilities to cover us for the unfortunate redundancies, forced on us by Covid 19. Our team is making a huge contribution in working together as a team, taking on additional tasks outside their previous work areas and doing their absolute best to ensure good service to our members and guests. Please acknowledge this whenever you can.

FINANCIAL

The financial setback resulted in a disappointing finish to our 2019/20 year, with a significant loss being recorded in March, the final month of the financial year. We are, as yet unable to produce accounts for April and May, due to being unable to close off our 2019/20 year end accounts.

The results for the first two months of our 2020/21 year, will also show a substantial loss which means we are starting our new financial year on the backfoot.

Whilst this position is foreign to us, our current Budget and Cash Flow forecasts indicate we can overcome these setbacks.

We applied for and received the second tranche of the Government Wage Subsidy, which will greatly assist in our recovery. We will however need continued strong support from you, our members and to resurrect our activity as a function and events venue. We are pleased to report bookings for the latter are showing positive signs.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

We are still unable to set a date for our AGM. The impact Covid 19 restrictions have had in getting accounts completed, our Audit completed together with an Audit of our Auditor's work, have led to further delays. We recently learned from our Auditor, their work has to be checked this year as they have been our Auditor for five consecutive years. Whilst we are now well into the process, completion is still a week or two away. As we are required to give notice of our AGM and have financial accounts available to members, at least 14 days prior to the meeting, we are now looking at an August date for our AGM this year.

We can advise our accounting work to date confirms our operating surplus for the 2019/20 is significantly up on the immediate previous year, so we all have something to look forward to.

We will advise a date for the AGM as soon as we are in a position to do so.


