OPERATIONS

Your Club continues to perform strongly with a very pleasing financial position year to date, further upgrades of our facilities and furnishings and very steady demand as a function and events venue. The latter is sadly again being disrupted by movement up and down Covid Alert Levels. We have experienced several cancellations and postponements of bookings which impact adversely on our planning and profitability. Nonetheless we are now getting more conditioned to these disruptions and it appears we may have to accept this of part of life for the foreseeable future.

We have commenced planning of our annual balance timetable, audit procedure and budget for the 21/22 year. Budgeting is again proving to be a difficult exercise. The Budget for the current year had been finalised just prior to Covid lockdown so has had little relevance to overall performance. At the time of lockdown last year we decided not to amend the budget based on what we knew then as the uncertainty surrounding us all at that time would have made that a pointless, time wasting exercise. It is also going to make preparation of our budget for the 21/22 year difficult as comparatives for several months are going to be irrelevant, as is the uncertain times ahead, we currently find ourselves in.

We will however proceed with preparation of these key documents and processes as best we can. Planning for our 50th Jubilee celebrations continues. Some of our Adjuncts will be hosting Tournaments and Chartered Clubs events during the year as part of the celebrations, the first of these being this month with our hosting of the National Fire Service and East Coast Chartered Clubs Outdoor Bowls Tournaments.

We look forward to welcoming visitors from throughout NZ to these events and proudly showing them what a great Club we have. We are also well advanced on planning for some exciting new projects which we have no doubt, will further enhance our financial position and long term sustainability. Details of these will be announced in due course.

Our Insurers have accepted our claim to replace our Cuneen Outdoor Bowling Green which was severely damaged in the November flooding. Work on replacing the green is expected to commence around the middle of this year. Tiger Turf, our service providers have indicated they will probably be able to carry out this work in the July/August period.

Whilst we do have the benefit of the Wage Subsidy in our accounts we also need to remember the lost trading we have experienced. Taking all into account your Committee is very satisfied with the financial performance to date and the outlook going forward. We are in the process of changing our accounting from Myob to Xero and we firmly believe this will be a positive change for us. From all the information we have obtained Xero will be more efficient for our business and very helpful in terms of financial

A LIVING MEMORIAL TO OUR FALLEN
IN 2019 OUR GSA MEMBERS, AS PART OF OUR ROLE IN
SUPPORTING PLACES OF REMEMBRANCE FOR THOSE WHO
SERVED, ESTABLISHED AT THE TARADALE RETURNED SERVICES
CEMETERY A 'LIVING MEMORIAL' TO THE 65 FALLEN FROM THE
TARADALE DISTRICT WHO GAVE THEIR LIVES IN WW1. THIS
CONSISTED OF PLANTING A TOTARA SEEDLING AT THE
CEMETERY FOR EACH OF THE FALLEN, WITH AN
ACCOMPANYING MEMORIAL CROSS DISPLAYING THEIR NAME.
IN SOME INSTANCES, WE WERE ABLE TO ARRANGE THAT A
DESCENDANT OF THE FALLEN PLANT THE TREE FOR THEIR
ANCESTOR.

THE PROJECT WAS UNDERTAKEN WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE NCC AND TE URU RAKAU (FORESTRY), WHO SUPPLIED THE SEEDLINGS AS PART OF PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMME WITH COMMUNITIES WHICH THEY CALL MATARIKI TU RAKAU, AIMED AT PLANTING NATIVE TREES TO RECOGNIZE THE SACRIFICE OF EVERY NZER WHO HAD NOT RETURNED FROM WAR. THE PLANTING TOOK PLACE ON ARBOR DAY 2019, ASSISTED BY STUDENTS OF THE TARADALE DISTRICT SECONDARY SCHOOLS. THOSE SEEDLINGS ARE NOW GROWING WELL, HELPED BY GSA MEMBERS REGULARLY WATERING THEM DURING THE DRY SUMMER MONTHS.

WE ARE NOW WORKING ON STAGE TWO OF THE PLANTING TO COMMEMORATE THOSE FROM THE DISTRICT WHO HAVE FALLEN IN BATTLES SINCE WWI – PRINCIPALLY THOSE WHO FELL DURING WW2. AGAIN, THE NCC AND TE URU RAKAU ARE ACTIVELY SUPPORTING OUR PLANS. A SITE FOR THE PLANTINGS HAS BEEN SELECTED AND CLEARED, PLANNING (INCLUDING IRRIGATION) IS UNDERWAY, AND KOWHAI AND POHUTUKAWA WILL BE PLANTED.

TO DATE OUR RESEARCH HAS IDENTIFIED THE LIST OF THOSE WHO 'DID NOT RETURN' AS SHOWN BELOW AND WE WILL PLANT A TREE FOR EACH OF THESE FALLEN HEROES, HOPEFULLY ON ARBOR DAY 2021 (5 JUNE 2021). PLEASE CONTACT THE GSA IF ANY OF THESE PERSONS WAS A RELATIVE OF YOURS, AND YOU WOULD LIKE TO PLANT THE TREE IN THEIR MEMORY (SOME FIT YOUNG PERSONS WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ASSIST YOU WITH THIS IF REQUIRED). ALSO, PLEASE LET US KNOW IF THERE ARE OTHER NAMES YOU BELIEVE WE HAVE MISSED AND SHOULD BE INCLUDED.
